### Dear Families:

The great celebrations of Christmas and Epiphany have now ended, leaving warmth in our hearts and souls.

In the following Sundays, the Church, through the Word of God, will present Jesus in his action of announcing the coming of the Kingdom of God. This Sunday introduces Jesus' first miracle.

Jesus was invited to a wedding. His mother, relatives and his disciples were also invited. A wedding is a very popular, cheerful event, which transmits love and happiness, and it affects not only the couple getting married, but also the relatives and guests. All partake of the joy of marriage. The Bible speaks of marriage as a symbol of the Kingdom of God: a great banquet where delicious food is plentiful and good. Jesus chose a wedding to perform his first miracle. Surrounded by his followers, relatives, acquaintances and friends and his own mother, he performs the miracle of turning water into wine. Jesus had already begun to be known for his preaching and by John the Baptist pointing him out as "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." But now, he will confirm his presence as "God among us", by performing miracles that testify to the arrival of the Kingdom of God.

The problem arising because of the lack of wine is serious for the young spouses: the celebration of their wedding would be a failure for lack of wine. Jesus performs the miracle so that the joy of the love of the couple is not tarnished, and to show that God wants to be present in the joys and sorrows of our lives: providing solutions to our problems and encouraging our illusions and zest for life and to do things right. Today, Jesus also would like to be invited to every wedding, but unfortunately, too often he is not. Today, he wants to encourage us to do the right thing and give each couple the "good wine" of divine blessings: The Sacrament of Matrimony.

I invite all the couples of our community whose marital situation is not what the Church teaches, to seek ways to find through dialogue with the priest, the necessary guidance to make their homes a place of encounter with God and find a peaceful conscience. I encourage couples to humbly seek what pleases God, regardless of money, or how big a celebration they can throw. What matters is the celebration of Jesus present in the blessing of every marriage. Take heart, your children will be happy and your friends will congratulate you.

May you all grow in faith, in the presence of Jesus, in every marriage that wants to live in peace with God.

### Queridas Familias:

Han terminado las grandes celebraciones de la Navidad y Epifanía que como cada año, han dado calor a nuestra alma.

Ahora ya siguen unos domingos en los que la Iglesia por medio de la Palabra de Dios nos va a presentar a Jesús actuando en el anuncio de la llegada del Reino de Dios. Este domingo nos presenta el primer milagro de Jesús.

Jesús estaba invitado a una boda, también su madre, parientes y sus discípulos. Una boda es algo bien popular, alegre, que trasmite amor y felicidad, y que afecta no solo a los que se casan sino a todos los parientes e invitados. Todos participan de la alegría del matrimonio. En la Biblia se habla de la boda como símbolo del Reino de Dios: un gran banquete donde abunda la comida exquisita y buena. Jesús eligió una boda para hacer su primer milagro. En medio de los suyos, parientes, conocidos y amigos y su propia madre hace el milagro de convertir el agua en vino. Ya Jesús había comenzado a tener fama por su predicación y por Juan Bautista que lo había señalado como "el cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo". Pero ahora va a ratificar su presencia como Dios entre nosotros haciendo los milagros que atestiguan la llegada del Reino de Dios.

El problema que se suscita por la falta de vino es serio para aquellos jóvenes esposos: la celebración de su boda iba a ser un fracaso por la falta de vino. Jesús hace el milagro para que la alegría del amor de aquellos esposos no se vea empañada, y para mostrar que Dios quiere estar presente en las alegrías y en las penas de nuestra vida: dando solución a nuestros problemas y alentando nuestras ilusiones y ganas de vivir y hacer las cosas bien. Hoy, también Jesús, quisiera ser invitado a todas las bodas, pero desgraciadamente muchas veces no cuenta. Hoy quiere animarnos para hacer las cosas bien y dar a cada pareja "el buen vino" de las bendiciones divinas: El Sacramento del Matrimonio.

Yo invito a todas las parejas de nuestra comunidad cuya situación matrimonial no sea la que enseña la Iglesia, a que busquen la manera de encontrar en el diálogo con el sacerdote la orientación que haga de su hogar un lugar de encuentro con Dios y con su conciencia tranquila y en paz. Animo a las parejas a buscar con sencillez lo que agrada a Dios, no importa si se tiene dinero o no, si se puede hacer fiesta o no: lo importante es la fiesta de Jesús presente en la bendición de cada matrimonio. Animense, sus hijos se alegrarán y sus amigos los felicitarán.

Que crezca en todos ustedes la fe en la presencia de Jesús en cada matrimonio que quiere vivir en paz con Dios.

**Statement of the Catholic Bishops of Florida on the 43rd Anniversary of Roe v. Wade**  
January 22, 2016

*"... protect and defend human life at every stage of its development."*  
Pope Francis, in his address to a joint session of the United States Congress, September 24, 2015

We are saddened by yet another anniversary of the tragic U.S. Supreme Court decision legalizing the abortion of unborn children as we profoundly mourn over 57 million lives that have consequently been lost.

During this last year, courageous lawmakers sought to reduce the evil of abortion in our state by advancing legislation establishing a reflection period prior to abortion so every woman may more fully consider the decision to abort an unborn child. We were deeply moved by the post-abortive women who came forward in every legislative committee hearing to reveal years of regret and deep wounds they have lived with as the result of terminating a pregnancy. Their courage and willingness to shed light on the evil of abortion is commendable and reminds us of the unassuming, yet life-changing, work of our post-abortive ministries who invite the many men and women harmed by abortion to a process of healing and spiritual restoration. The judicial challenge to this law, however, reaffirms the considerable work that remains ahead as a "privacy clause" in our state's constitution has been interpreted by the courts as uniquely granting greater abortion rights than the U.S. Constitution.

Recent attention to the allegations of illegal selling of fetal tissue has confirmed what we have said for many years: abortion is evil. We call for the government subsidies that fund our nation's abortion providers to be reallocated to community health centers and other federally qualified health centers that do not promote or perform abortions.

Pope Francis has frequently admonished us against a "throwaway culture." The Holy Father has reminded us in his latest encyclical, *Laudato Si'*, that all life is interrelated. To call ourselves unequivocally pro-life requires that we always choose life, even when it most challenges us: whether encountering an unplanned pregnancy, ill and dying loved ones, the execution of a convicted criminal, or the stranger seeking refuge in our communities. Recognizing we often fall short of this great task, we are jubilant that this Year of Mercy, called for by Pope Francis, invites us to seek forgiveness and find peace through the miracle of God's infinite and inexplicable mercy.

While we lament the 43rd anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court decision in *Roe vs. Wade*, we are also encouraged by the commemoration of a different anniversary. On the 450th anniversary of the founding of St. Augustine, Catholic Floridians proudly celebrated the establishment of our nation's earliest Catholic parish which first sowed the seeds of our faith on this land with a special devotion to our Blessed Mother, still echoed at the shrine of Our Lady of La Leche y Buen Parto. In these last four and a half centuries, our faith has served as witness to the Good News of Jesus Christ through the greatest of adversities. We invite the Catholic faithful to renew their commitment of proclaiming the Gospel throughout our land and consecrate our continued work of protecting the unborn to the motherly heart of Our Lady.
